

***READING COMPREHENSION LEVEL 5* BY ESSENTIAL SKILLS SOFTWARE: CORRELATION TO THE GEORGIA PERFORMANCE STANDARDS**

This document outlines the correlations between Georgia's English Language Arts (ELA) Performance Standards and the Reading Comprehension Level 5 program from Essential Skills Software.
